Guidelines for preparation and submission of abstracts

1. General information

1.1. **Deadline for submission: Thursday, 30th April 2009.**

1.2. You may be the first author of more than one volunteered scientific paper provided that each submission represents distinct research.

1.3. The organising committee reserves the right, at its sole discretion, to decline any abstracts deemed unacceptable.

1.4. Should your abstract be accepted, you will have the opportunity to submit an extended version (up to two pages) of the paper. You will find the information required for the final submission in due course.

2. Abstract preparation

2.1. **Please use the template provided** and follow the instructions below.

2.2. The title should be as brief as possible but it must indicate clearly the nature of the study.

2.3. Abstracts should state concisely the background, methods, results and conclusions of the work.

2.4. If required, references should be cited in full within the abstract and formatted in CBP style, following the examples below. The appropriate output style for *EndNote* users can be downloaded [here](#).
